Date: 07-06-2018

Participants: 36 members

The community visit to Divya Jyoti Trust in Jaibharath Nagar, Bangalore, was organized as part of the community service activities by the School of Economics and Commerce. 












About The Seminar

The way Criminal Justice in India is designed and administered today, hardly serves the purpose for which it was set up. Frustrated by recent events, people today, are accusing our Criminal Justice system of not doing enough to deter criminals. They blame the delay and uncertainties involved in its age-old processes, the ridiculously ineffective punishments it imposes on those few who get convicted and in general, the colonial attitude that it represents. It is argued that the system provides wide discretion to the police and the prosecution, rendering the system vulnerable to corruption and manipulation and thereby, endangering basic rights of innocent citizens. The judiciary, although well intentioned, is overburdened and understaffed. The media is unhindered and public, helpless.

Oftentimes the entire system gets so caught up, that the real victim is ignored and finds himself/herself presented with a situation that compels him/her to regret approaching the police and the courts. Often the victim is forced to find extra-legal methods of getting justice. However, worst affected, are those that choose to avoid the system altogether and wither away in silence.

The victim's gender too plays a significant role, in terms of the impact that our generalized procedures differ. There are numerous areas in which day-to-day practices in the criminal justice system ignores behavioural and situational differences between female and male offenders. We need to create a community response to the issues that impact women's lives and increase the perpetrator's risk of incarceration. The women in our society ought to be provided with services that, in both context and content, are comprehensive and relate to the realities of their lives.

At present, both the availability of programming for women offenders and the types of services offered fall short of what is needed. In creating appropriate services that truly consider and respond to gender and cultural factors, we first need to re-examine our current criminal justice policies. We can then work to adjust those policies so that the response to women related offences is the one that emphasizes human needs, specifically those that reflect the realities of women's lives. Rather than focusing solely on punitive sanctions. we can begin to systematically consider the least restrictive alternatives to incarceration. The benefits to society from a reduction in women's imprisonment and from improved re-integration of female offenders into the community are not only apparent but also quite evident. It will benefit not only the women themselves, but also generations to come.




Day 1: 22/11/2019






Report: Community Outreach at Guanella Preethi Nivas

Report on Life Skills Education for Primary School Children

Community Service Programme (CSP)
Kolur Rural Community (Adopted)

Date: 21st August 2021

Organized by: School of Liberal Studies **Participants:** 30 Primary School Students

On the 21st of August 2021, the School of Liberal Studies organized a Community Service Programme (CSP) aimed at providing life skills education to primary school children in the Kolur Rural Community. This initiative was part of the university's ongoing efforts to engage with and contribute to the development of rural communities. The Kolur community, an adopted community by the university, was the focus of this program, which involved 30 primary school students from the area.

2. Objectives of the Programme







CSP Activity 1





<u>Objectives</u> - To understand the importance of keeping the environment sustainable by not just planting valuable saplings but also ensuring they are well maintained for the coming years.

The activity was performed by joining hands with E-Cure (founded in 2011, an independent not-for-profit organization that aims to protect and conserve the environment). The day began with talks of brainstorming at current generation issues for the environment and finding out sustainable solutions for those issues. My Choices foundation (works to break the cycle of violence, abuse, and exploitation suffered by women, children, and families across vulnerable communities in India) raised the voice for alarming situation of human trafficking and called for CMR university students to ensure they become aware of their roles and responsibilities in dealing with the alarming indices of human trafficking. The next two hours were dedicated to the importance of the saplings to be planted and what are the optimum conditions for them to grow into valuable trees in some years.

The students dedicated themselves towards cleaning the weeds around the place and digging the soil and planting the saplings beautifully.

The students of CMR university spent these 8 hours towards nature and sustainable growth of the environment, which became an experience for broad range positive development of them as part of society.











Food Donation to the needy

Continuing the legacy of taking active participation in serving the community around, CMR university students took over their 1st CSP activity on 17/02/23.

The data release in the later part of the year 2022 about the Global Hunger Index highlighted the issue of food scarcity in our community. Com general at CMR university decided to cook healthy food and distribute the same to needy people in the community. They had identified areas like slums of the city to do this service. The three key features they added to the food to be served, hence, was health, hygiene and humbleness with which they approached different needy people in Bangalore city and gave away the food packets to them. The activity was performed by our students in different places where they took turns section wise.
